Registration Information 2012 Summer Outdoor Soccer for Youth

Open to all Players born in 1994 to 2007 inclusive. We serve the Orleans, Cumberland, Navan, and surrounding areas.

Applications will be processed on a first come, first serve basis.
There is no guarantee a spot will be available in all age groups as space is extremely limited.

How to register for the 2012 Summer Outdoor Season?

- The CUSC has introduced a new ONLINE registration system and all details on how to use it can be found on the website at www.cumberlandsoccer.com (under "Registration tab and then click on "2012 Summer Registration")

How much will it cost in 2012 if registered before March 1/2012:

- Players born in 2007 to 2004 \$170 (\$190 after Feb. 29/2012) Full Coloured uniform is included in the fee
- Players born in 2003 to 1994 \$170 (\$190 after Feb. 29/2012) Blue & White uniform is required but **NOT** included in the fees
- Volunteer Fee \$35 per family per civic address – refundable on completion of a valid volunteer duty
- Cobra Evaluation Fee \$25 per player trying out for Representative team (born in 1999 to 1994 only)
- Family Max (Youth Only) \$425 excludes Volunteer fee and Cobra Evaluation fee (No Family max. after Feb. 29/2012).
- NSF cheques are subject to a \$25 admin fee and must be replaced with a certified cheque or money order within 7 days.
- Each youth player will receive a new soccer ball, yearend memento, and Photos will be arranged for all players and teams but the cost is not included in the registration fees this year.

Volunteer Fee:

- \$35 volunteer fee is mandatory** for each family per civic address and is refunded if you register and complete a valid volunteer duty.
- Please ensure you read the description of the Volunteer Fee found at: www.cumberlandsoccer.com, under "Volunteer" tab

Note the following requirements:

- ONLINE system accepts VISA or MASTERCARD. The Office accepts DEBIT or Cheque/Money Order only.**
- If a player is new to the CUSC, we will need a copy of any government document containing both their name and birth date.
- We will do our best to meet special requests for language of instruction and friends on applications **received by Feb. 29/2012**

Withdrawals (see Refund Policy on the website under the About Us tab and then click on Documents/Forms/Policies.

- A \$25 per player admin fee will be applied to all withdrawals before May 1/12
- A \$50 per player admin fee will be applied to all withdrawals between May 1/12 and June 1/12
- Cobra Evaluation fees and late fees are non-refundable.
- No refund is possible for players who withdraw after being offered a position on a Cobra Team and accept the offer.
- All requests for withdrawals must be in writing (letter or email) to the Administrator (admin@cumberlandsoccer.com)

Cobra Representative Teams:

- If you are intending to be evaluated for a Cobra team you must register before proceeding to the scheduled evaluation. Evaluators will be provided with a list of registered players and will be instructed **NOT** to permit unregistered players to try out. If you are unsuccessful in becoming a member of a Cobra team, your name will be returned to the appropriate Development League division and assigned to a Development League team.

Fair Play Code For Athletes

1. I will participate because I want to, not just because my parents or coaches want me to.
2. I will play by the rules, and in the spirit of the game.
3. I will control my temper - fighting and "mouthing off" can spoil the activity for everybody.
4. I will respect my opponents.
5. I will do my best to be a true team player.
6. I will remember that winning isn't everything - that having fun, improving skills, making friends and doing my best are also important.
7. I will acknowledge all good plays / performances - those of my team and of my opponents.
8. I will remember that coaches and officials are there to help me. I will accept their decisions and show them respect.

My child and I, as members of Cumberland United, support the Fair Play Philosophy, and will read the Fair Play Codes together and will abide by them to the best of our ability.

All players will be expected to sign their complete agreement of the "Fair Play Code for Athletes" and all parents will be expected to honour and lead by example the "Fair Play Code for Parents".

Fair Play Code For Parents

1. I will not force my child to participate in sports.
2. I will remember that my child plays sport for their own enjoyment, not for mine.
3. I will encourage my child to play by the rules and to resolve conflicts without resorting to hostility or violence.
4. I will teach my child that doing one's best is as important as winning, so that my child will never feel defeated by the outcome of a game.
5. I will make my child feel like a winner every time by offering praise for competing fairly and trying hard.
6. I will never ridicule or yell at my child for making a mistake or losing a game.
7. I will remember that children learn best by example. I will applaud good plays / performances by both my child's team and their opponents.
8. I will never question the officials' judgement or honesty in public.
9. I will support all efforts to remove verbal and physical abuse from children's sporting activities.
10. I will respect and show appreciation for the volunteers who give their time to provide sport activities for my child.



2012 Registration for CUSC Soccer Referees So you want to be a Soccer Referee?

OSA Mini Soccer Referee Course for 12 and 13 year olds. You must turn 12 by March 31, 2012 (no exceptions) to be eligible to take this one day course.

CSA Entry Level Referee Course - This course is designed by the Canadian Soccer Association with the aim of providing a more uniform approach in teaching the Laws of the Game, leading to a greater degree of uniformity in the understanding and application of the Laws. Participants are required to pre-register for the course and complete a pre-course workbook, in-class workbook, and pass a **mandatory written examination** at the conclusion of the course. Those who pass the examination will be certified as CSA District Referees (if over the age of 16) or CSA Youth Referees (if under the age of 16). You must turn 14 by March 31, 2012 to take this two day course.



We especially need **MATURE Adults** to become Referees, so please sign up as soon as possible. Please note that priority is given to members of the CUSC as the Club pays for the course and license fees (max of \$25.00) if you referee at least 8 games each year. If you want to be a new referee this year, please send an email to: headreferee@cumberlandsoccer.com. We will only be hiring about 40-50 new referees this year, so advise Franco via email if you want a spot and he will let you know when and where the job interviews will be held.
